- The City of Madison Common Council formally approved the project plan for the Isthmus Safety Initiative, a project working to reduce gun crime and sexual violence downtown. DMI is a member of the steering committee and advisory committee.
- Jason continues to serve on the International Downtown Association (IDA) Public Policy Committee. As part of the Committee work, we're analyzing ways to support more Federal funding for locally based grant programs, including Madison's own Isthmus Safety Initiative.

## **Inclusiveness:**
