- DMI hosted several events and committee meetings this month including our What's Up
 Downtown Breakfast. At the Breakfast, Anne Neujahr Morrison of New Year Investments and
 Larry Kilmer, II of the City of Madison, presented on planning for the future at the Community
 Development Authority (CDA) Triangle Properties. DMI also hosted a New Faces, New Places
 event at the recently renovated Madison Club in downtown.
